- Have participated actively in community service activities

3. Good character

- Have obtained a Conduct Grade of at least 'Good' in Primary 5 and 6

## **Shortlisting Criteria**

All applicants who meet all the eligibility criteria will be shortlisted.

## **Selection Criteria**

All shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interaction session.

The teacher-in-charge will contact the applicant/parent/guardian to discuss the details.

## **Documents to submit**

- Primary 5 Mid-Year and End-of-Year result slips and Primary 6 Mid-Year result slips
- Other supporting documents (encouraged):
  - Character Awards (Edusave Character Award (ECHA), School-based Character Award, etc)
  - Record of involvement and contribution(s) in Values-In-Action projects at school- or community-level
  - Record of leadership responsibilities
  - Record of Co-Curricular activities
  - Teacher's referral letter and/or testimonials
  - Other relevant portfolio of achievements/awards

Please arrive about 20 minutes before the interaction session in order to complete the verification of documents. Present the above documents to the staff in the General Office. If you do not have the original document, please have the photocopy certified by the issuing school/organisation before sending in together with your application form.
